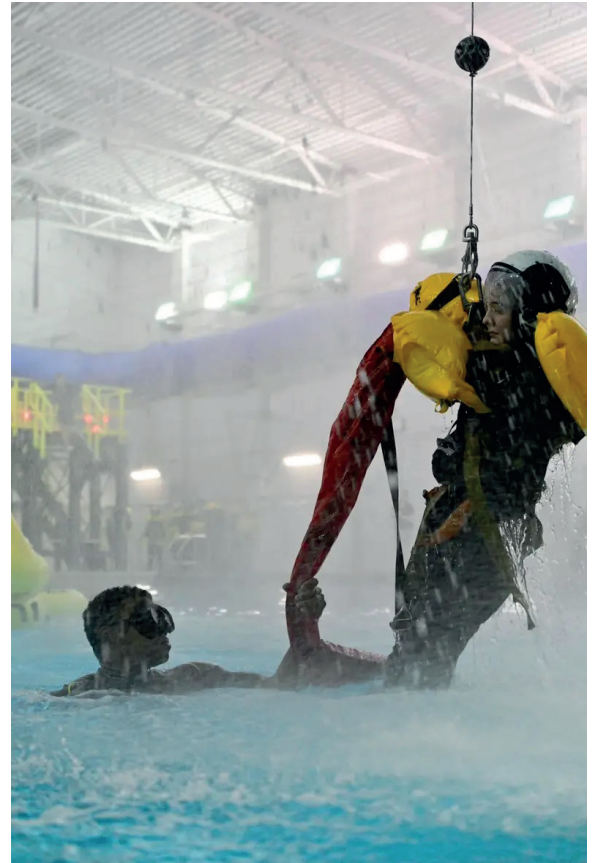
This award is a testament to the value of having a good support system, participating in as many trainings as you're able, and giving as much as possible through leadership, followership, and dedication to your shipmates.

No formula can spell it out for you, so all the advice in the world means nothing until you put it into practice and tailor it to your strengths and weaknesses. This is a lifelong challenge that we get to participate in. So keep learning, giving 100% to your shipmates, and swim.

None of these experiences could happen without a support system. Mine has come from two groups: the family I live with that has consistently provided me with the ability to do as much as possible and encouraged me along the way, and also the family I've found in my unit, Lone Star Squadron, whose outstanding members have mentored, supported, and challenged me throughout my journey giving me exactly the tools I need to succeed.

I have loved being a Sea Cadet, and especially being able to serve as a chief petty officer, but this time in my life is coming to a close. I don't precisely know who I would be if I had never joined the Sea Cadets all those years ago. I do, however, know that the Sea Cadets has provided me with the best foundation a high school senior could have and has inspired and prepared me for a career in medicine as a paramedic. Keep being amazing Sea Cadets by swimming through each challenge. The reward will be priceless..guaranteed.

My Sea Cadet journey started when my big brother joined the Navy League Cadets when he was 10 and I was 3. When my brother became the command chief, he told me I had to try out the Navy League Cadets. After telling him “No” many times, I agreed to give it a try and joined. I attended Navy League Orientation (NLO) at Fort Custer, Michigan, in my first year when I was 10. I made three friends at this training that I still keep in touch with, and I was selected as the honor cadet.

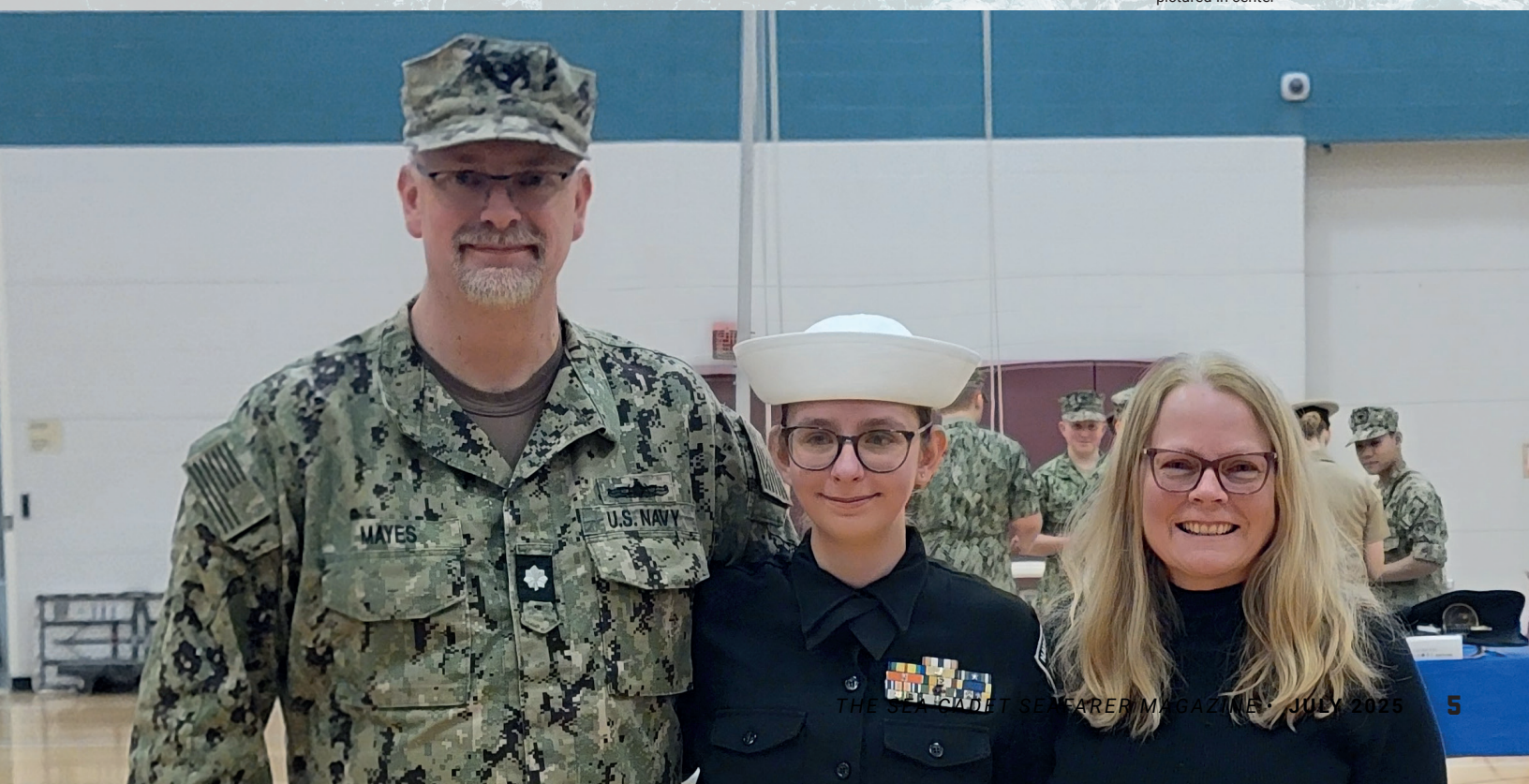
After my experience at NLO, I decided that I really liked the Navy League Cadets. The following year, I attended a Navy League advanced training. I loved the Sea Cadet officers who were in charge of this training as they really inspired me to do my best. My third year in the program, I attended a Sea Cadet STEM training at the Naval Academy and a forensics training at Fort Custer.

The League Cadets have helped improve my confidence in public speaking and leadership. My mother inspires me to keep going and to never quit.

Last October, I developed Type I diabetes. I was in the ICU and then the hospital for multiple days. I had to learn a new way of life. The people who supported me the most were my parents, my brother, and my best friend. I lost a lot of weight and strength from this ordeal. I lost 20 percent of my body weight, had to learn how exercise would affect my blood sugar, and how to make sure it did not go too low while I was running. My goal was to score at least a Level 3 on my Sea Cadet physical readiness test (PRT) the following April so I could attend Sea Cadet Recruit Training that summer. I ended up scoring a Level 4. If I had any advice I would say “Never quit, keep going, no matter what.”

My future goal is to become a pediatric endocrinologist.

I first found out about the Sea Cadets when my mom showed me a recruitment video that had scuba diving. I was ten. I thought the program was really cool, and I signed up a couple of days later. Soon after, I went to Navy League Orientation (NLO) where I learned that I could succeed on my own. Even though it was a challenge, I was able to get through something that very few people my age had ever gone through. This gave me a newfound feeling of confidence.

After NLO, I returned to help staff it, which was an excellent learning experience because I was able to learn from its leaders who provided me with experience and knowledge about how to be a good leader myself. Eventually, I aged up and became a Sea Cadet and went to Sea Cadet Recruit Training (RT). My company was recognized as honor company.

After that experience, I went to my favorite training, The Sailing Ships of Maine, where I spent a week on a double-masted schooner called the Sarah Jane, learning how to sail around Maine. After that, I attended a Sea Cadet honor guard training, then staffed NLO in the role of master-at-arms (MAA). From there, I attended Sea Cadet Petty Officer Leadership Academy (POLA) where I was one of the honor cadets. I staffed NLO again as a recruit division commander (RDC), where our company earned honor company.

In addition to the Sea Cadets, my family and friends have always kept me on track and supported me. Overall, what I have learned from all these trainings and the people I have met is that RT may seem scary because of the unknown experience. After completing RT, you feel the biggest sense of accomplishment knowing you did something that almost no one your age has ever done. As a bonus, you're then able to do some of the coolest trainings ever; and the people you meet at trainings are often some of the nicest people out there. I have met some of my best friends through the Sea Cadets.

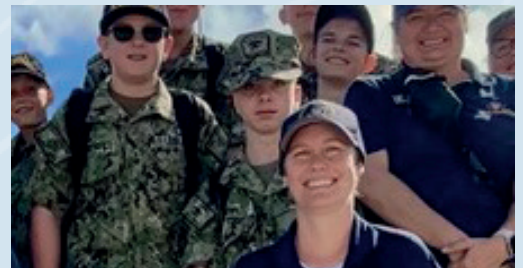

As you learned in RT, that's how growth occurs. Support your shipmates - that's how community forms. And uphold the Core Values - that's how character develops.

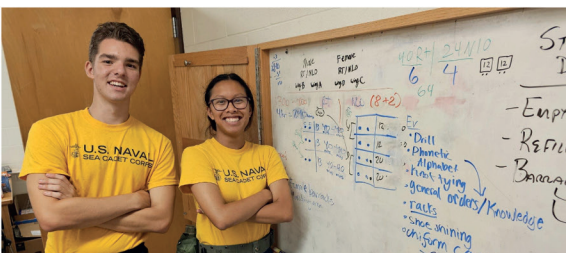
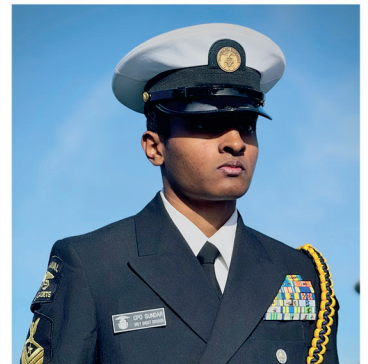
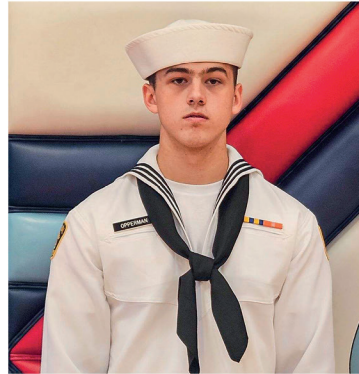
